Morning Rhythm

The Heartworks Summer Pre-School for children ages two to five provides a creative and enriching environment for young children to enjoy the summer months in the company of friends old and new. The program is designed for a full week of attendance, although part time schedules are available.

Mornings will follow a relaxed rhythm similar to the schedule below.

Circle Time: Children gather each morning to share news of the upcoming day. Teachers will provide information for discussion related to the current theme. Circle often includes lots of singing, movement, educational games and stories.

Enrichment Time: Children join in activities that enhance the experience of their theme through art, cooking, science experiments, drama, outdoor hikes and more. Theme material comes to life in this creative part of the morning.

Snack: Snacks are brought from home each day and shared mid-morning in the style of a family meal.

Outside Time: Children enjoy the playground equipment, play in the wading pools, go for a nature walk or pick a nice spot in the shade for quiet play.

Story by Heart: The children will invite the Mother of the Fairy Tale for a special story shared by their teacher. This is a magical end to the morning.

Lunch: Children gather their lunch boxes and enjoy a meal together, often outside on a beautiful day.

We are a nut free school. Please check all labels when preparing snacks and lunches.

Weekly Themes

Week 1 Underground Critters and Creatures: Who lives inside the earth, under trees, in the dirt of our gardens or the mud in the pond? Let's investigate. (June 25-June 29)

Week 2 Under the Big Top: The circus is coming to town! Become a lion tamer, a tight-rope walker or the ring master. (July 2-July 6)
No Camp on Wednesday July 4.

Week 3 Jungle Safari: Explore the mysterious animals, birds and creatures that live deep in the jungle. (July 9-13)

Week 4 Snap, Clap, Tap and Sing: Stories and songs will come to life using music, movement and drama. (July 16-20)

Week 5 6 Polar Lands: Journey with us to the top and bottom of our planet to see what new discoveries we can make. (July 23-27)

Week Living Storybooks: Favorite children's literature will come to life through art, music and drama. (July 30-August 3)

Week 7 Starry, Starry Night: What happens when the sun goes down? Animals of the night, stars, moons, planets and more. (August 6-10)

Week 8 Earth Art: Create works of art with materials from our natural surroundings. (August 13-17)

What Happens After Lunch?

12:30-4:00

If your child has an afternoon nap, once lunch is complete, a quiet place for rest and sleep is provided.

The children who do not nap will have additional opportunities for play and learning in the afternoon. Circle and enrichment time in the afternoon often include drama, music and physical education. The children will also have time to enjoy the playground and the wading pools.

Around 2:30, the children who are napping will begin to wake up and join their friends.
