Curriculum Overview

Personalized Academic Excellence

Children learn best when they are both challenged and supported by their teachers, peers and families. At The Renaissance School, we believe that children also learn best when they can do so at their own pace, in ways that work best for them. We call our approach *personalized academic excellence*. Here's what our approach means for your child:

1. *Individualized Learning Plans* – We work closely with each child to identify areas of interest, strength and need. We then create an academic plan that incorporates those factors and allows them the opportunity to learn the way they learn best. Each child's plan is unique, combining what they must learn with what they love while including time and opportunity for in-depth learning and for special projects.
2. *Rich Challenging Curriculum* – At The Renaissance School, we combine a strong focus on basic literacy, mathematics, science and social studies skills with regular instruction in music, theater, art and foreign language (French and Spanish).
3. *Depth and Integration* – We offer our students the chance to take their special interests in each subject area a great distance. They create their own long-term projects and, as a class, they pursue year-long themes. They learn the basics – math, science, literacy – in an integrated way, not only in specialty classes but also in units that enable them to see how the subject areas interrelate.
4. *Small Class Size* – Our classes have approximately 14 children with one classroom teacher. Our small class size makes our personalized approach possible and gives children the opportunity to develop close relationships with their teachers and peers. Another benefit of the small class size, as one of our teachers commented, is that “so much gets done in one day”.
5. *Multi-faceted Learning* – We take advantage of our school setting to offer children the chance for hands-on learning. We combine outdoor experiences, art, music, field trips, cooking projects, classroom work and discussion to ensure that students learn with all their senses engaged.
6. *Freedom to Teach* – When asked what they liked best about teaching at The Renaissance School our teachers noted the freedom to teach and create. Our teachers are able to follow their own skills and talents and the interests of the children to provide a creative, enriching academic experience.
7. *Highest Common Denominator* – We believe that children are capable of far more than is often imagined. We give our students the support and the resources they need to achieve to the maximum of their potential, beyond the baseline of a minimum standard. We help all students to reach toward their highest potential.

Our Warm Spirited Community

The Renaissance School is a truly unique school community that can be best appreciated once it is experienced. Our community is warm, engaging and enthusiastic. When you spend some time at The Renaissance School, here is what you will see:

1. *Family-School Relationship* – Our small size and warm community mean that we get to know not only our students but also their parents, siblings and others who help care for them. This relationship helps children feel welcome and safe. Families partner with the school to support learning experiences both at school and at home.
2. *Living and Teaching Our Values* – Our school was founded upon and continues to share values of peace, kindness and respect – for others and for the environment. We integrate these values into our classroom work and through special classroom discussions and events. We encourage students to participate in community service both on Shelburne Farms and in the local and world community.
3. *Friendship Across Age Levels* – Our small size and personalized approach to learning mean that children get to know students from other classrooms and grade levels. Students offer both friendship and mentoring to one another and have the rare opportunity to build relationships with older and younger children alike.
4. *Life on the Farm* – We make full use of the wonderful Shelburne Farms setting to create a memorable school experience. Renaissance students are part of the Shelburne Farms community, participating in farm chores and learning from and with the animals and natural beauty that surrounds them. Our playground is located in the surrounding fields and trees that the children affectionately refer to as the “enchanted forest”. Our legacy is that our students leave our school with a sense of place in the natural environment and an understanding of how agriculture and forestry contribute to our common life together.
5. *Staff Camaraderie* – Our teachers often mention how much they appreciate and value their close working relationships with one another. They learn from each other, teach each other and share ideas and approaches to learning. “It’s such an open and honest exchange,” commented one teacher. “I look to the future and see us here, working together.”
6. *Rhythm and Tradition* – At The Renaissance School, we value celebration and tradition. We start each day with a circle and end each day with a story. We see holidays, festivals and performances as a special part of the student’s experience and a way to bring the school community together.

2012-2013 Enrollment Tuition and Fees

Base Tuition: \$11,500.00

School Calendar: September – June, 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Tuition can be paid in full on or before July 1, 2012, in two equal parts on July 1, 2012 and December 1, 2012, or in ten equal monthly installments beginning July 2012 and ending April 2013. Payments are due on the 1st of the month. A \$25 late fee will be applied to each payment received after the 10th day of the month.

There is a non-refundable \$600.00 deposit due at enrollment.
Your child will not be placed on a class list until this deposit is received.
This deposit is applied to the annual tuition.

Annual Enrollment and Supply Fee:	Grades K – 3	\$500.00/year
	Grades 4 – 8	\$750.00/year
